THE DISASTERS THAT OCCURRED IN THE MT. ELGON REGION AT UGANDA MEDIA CENTRE

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AND REFUGEES

2ND AUGUST, 2022

1.0 INTRODUCTION

On the night of 30th July 2022, the Bugisu and Sebei regions received heavy rains that started at10:00 p.m. The rains were forecasted by UNMA in weather outlook for August, 2022, publication release on Friday 28th July 2022.

The heavy downpour caused some rivers from Kapchorwa district to bust their banks. This lead to flooding & landslides in the districts of Mbale, Manafwa, Bulambuli and Kapchorwa. The flooding & landslides displaced thousands

of locals from their homes, destroyed property, infrastructure and their livelihoods.

2.0 OCCURRENCE OF HAZARDS IN THE MT. ELGON REGION ON 30^{TH} JULY 2022

The Elgon region is prone to a range of disasters that fall in three geographical zones.

The upper zone experiences landslides, mass wasting, development of cracks, hail storms, rock rolls, lightening, crop and animal pests/diseases. The mid zone experiences landslides, flash floods, rock falls and mass wasting while the lower is prone to prolonged dry spells, floods, siltation, high levels of water borne diseases, animal/crop pests and diseases.

During the night of 30th July 2022, Bulambuli and Manafwa districts received very heavy rainfall that lasted for more than five hours across all the three geographical zones. Some rivers originating from Kapchorwa District burst their banks and flooded.

The hazards that occurred include floods in mostly Bulambuli constituency and also along the main rivers of Manafwa, Tsusu, Liisi and Pasa causing the opening up of cracks, landslides, rock falls and massive soil erosion. The flooding destroyed riverbanks, peoples' homes, gardens (crops), animals, bridges, roads, water points (destroyed, contaminated & blocked) and sub-merged.

Six (6) Districts and one City have reported major damages and losses i.e Mbale District, Mbale City, Kapchorwa, Bulambuli, Namisindwa, Sironko and Manafwa. The most affected areas were in Mbale City arising from Nabuyonga river with more deaths recorded, Vehicles damaged, Houses, Schools and Livestock.

The floods are attributed to the encroachment on the fragile areas and bad agricultural practices. District damages is reported as follows;

Mbale City 23 deaths 2 children females, 6 Males (1 UPDF official, 1Boda rider, 5 Unknown Cadres), 4 Females. 8 patients have been Injured & rescued, 9 Cars were swept downstream by floods.

3 Have been recovered;

- Subaru 4 occupants, 2 rescued;
- 2 missing, wish 3 occupants (2 survived, 1 missing)
- Harrier No occupants- parked at home.
- Super Custom still submerged with 11 occupants. 1 driver survived.

Affected 800 Households 80 houses damaged. 30 people have taken shelter at Pencote a Private primary school. Industrial park equipment and products have been damaged with buildings submerged

3 Motorcycles; 2 Motorcycles submerged and 1 Boda Rider survived, 2 occupants are missing.

Sironko district 3 deaths. Villages around Sironko Town Council, Bukise S/C, Busambya, Bumukha, Doko, Nabirete, Dorcus, Bukiyende, Namirende. No. of people affected: Households 480.

In total **29 deaths** have been reported and the bodies are in Mbale City Mortuary, 35 people sustained injures. However, the search and rescue exercise is still ongoing.

3.0 ACTIONS TAKEN SO FAR.

- Rapid assessment by the Ministry of Relief, Disaster Preparedness, NECOC, Mbale Emergency Operations Center, World Health Organization, Red cross, Commissioner Emergency medical services.
- 2. Search, rescue and retrieval of persons/bodies by the Uganda Red Cross Society & Uganda Police Force.
- 3. The Ministry of Health team is on the ground taking care of emergencies
- 4. Delivering relief items to the rightful/ intended beneficiaries/ survivors by my ministry and URCS

4.0 IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

1. The implementation of the proposed course of action will employ an Inter-Ministerial, Inter-Agency approach involving the whole Government, Donors, NG0s and Communities with the Office of the Prime Minister through the Ministry of Relief, Disaster Preparedness and Refugees taking lead.

2. The Office of the Prime Minister through the Ministry of Relief, Disaster Preparedness and Refugees is taking lead coordinating all Sector Ministries, Local Governments, Departments, Agencies and Partners through the existing National Platform for Disaster Preparedness and Management and the National Emergency Coordination and Operations Centre using the Disaster Risk Management Plan which was recently approved.

5.0 ACTION TO BE TAKEN

- a) Infrastructure—Roads especially those in landslide and flood prone areas need urgent fixing to enable farming and commercial activities to go on. Ministry of works should help with restoration of damaged infrastructure.
- b) Medical supplies need to be delivered to the displaced families especially to vulnerable mothers and children. Ministry of health should take the lead in delivering the required medical supplies.
- c) Relief measures to deliver both food and non-food items will be undertaken by the Ministry for Relief, Disaster Preparedness and refugees.
- d) The long-term solution is to have everyone living on the slopes of Mt. Elgon and along the river banks relocated to a safer geographical landscape.
